



# PRAYER LETTER

September 2010

*“For this reason, they are before the throne of God; and they serve Him day and night in His temple; and He who sits on the throne shall spread His tabernacle over them. They shall hunger no more, neither thirst anymore; neither shall the sun beat down on them, nor any heat; for the Lamb in the center of the throne shall be their shepherd, and shall guide them to springs of the water of life; and God shall wipe every tear from their eyes.”* Revelation 7: 15-17



### Day 1

A Delta employee in Atlanta recently died suddenly, leaving behind a wife, also a Delta agent. Pray as she is now facing tremendous grief as she tries to return to her job without him there. Pray God’s peace, comfort and provision will be evident in her heart and life. Pray co-workers will be faithful to reach out to her as they are able. Pray watching co-workers will be drawn to our Savior through these circumstances.

### Day 2

Pray as one airline employee wrote to our office in response to a “Thought for the Day” we had sent by e-mail: *“... couldn’t have sent it at a better time. Thank you so very, very much as right now my spirits are so very low in my work area. I am having to fight a battle to keep my job, but I know that God is able and can do anything but fail. Thank you so much. Please keep me in your prayers.”*

### Day 3

Pray for a pilot who was furloughed in 2008. Soon after, he found a job as a chief pilot working hospital medivac flights. He now has opportunity to return to his airline job and is prayerfully seeking God’s wisdom in doing so. The decision is not easy for various reasons ... including instability of the airline industry, demands of shift work in his present job, personal limitations as he grows older, and consideration of his family (wife and four small children). He asks us to pray for godly counsel and direction.

### Day 4

Pray as the German/Swiss Conference will be held September 24-26 in Germany. Pray God will use this time to encourage His people. Also pray for Paul and Claudette Curtas as they will be a part of the conference. Paul will be the speaker, and Claudette will translate as needed.

### Day 5

On September 19-20, the FCAP Board of Directors will meet here at the FCAP office. Pray for spiritual sharpness and strength as they pray together and seek God’s heart and desires for the ministry as a whole. We are facing many exciting opportunities but some challenges as well, including financial restraints that do have a bearing on what we are able to do. Decisions on such issues can sometimes be very difficult, but we know our God is able and will show us the way.

### Day 6

As with many other ministries and personal households, finances remain a challenge for us here at FCAP. Through the month of July, donations for the year have averaged \$11,010/month. Our basic monthly operational expenses are \$14,012. Pray God will give us wisdom in responding with the resources that are made available. It is because of financial limitations that the TRIM TAB has not been published since the end of 2009. In its stead, we are attempting to increase utilization of the internet to provide publications that will continue to encourage and help airline people throughout the world. Ministry opportunities are bountiful — pray for God’s continued financial provision according to His plans and purposes and for His glory. Give thanks for how He carries us through every step of the way.

### Day 7

**FCAP DAY OF PRAYER — Pray for revival in the hearts and lives of airline people worldwide!** Continue to pray for contacts in Paris, France. A pilot named Mark with EasyJet contacted us. He has now connected with a flight attendant named Monica, and they both desire to see Christians connected there. Pray the Lord of the harvest will bring forth laborers to join them in this outreach and in asking God to bring spiritual influence to the airline community in Paris.

### Day 8

Please be in prayer as a woman is divorcing her husband and refuses to go to Christian counseling. A Christian brother close to the situation is caught between her and her husband and needs wisdom in how to deal with the situation. The woman is a professing Christian and has been a friend and supporter of ministry in her area. Give thanks for a radio interview taped regarding the Airport Chaplaincy ministry in Boise. As the interview is aired, pray it will result in good exposure for both the chapel and for FCAP.

### Day 9

Over the years, we have prayed for MANY who are facing serious illness. Time and time again, we have witnessed God’s faithfulness in the midst of such struggle. Recently, Kathy Dunham, retired from Northwest Airlines in Minneapolis, has been included in our prayers as she struggles with ALS. Kathy recently wrote the following, and we wanted to share it with you in its entirety, knowing it will encourage you as you pray for Kathy and others:

*“Precious family and friends,*

*I have repeatedly said that I see God in every aspect of my care, but last week I received a gift from Him that completely took me by surprise. My last Caring Bridge I posted that power wheelchairs cost between \$10,000 and \$20,000. Sue, a friend of mine who works at Grace Church as Director of Women’s Ministries, saw that post and emailed me that a power wheelchair had been donated to Grace Church. Not only would they loan it to me for as long as I needed it, but Grace Church would also pay to tune it up, put new batteries in it, and deliver it to me. What a gift from God!*

*It is so blessed and such an honor to stand in the fire with Christ by my side. Our Master knows no limit of power or boundary of mission. He is so prolific of grace, that like the sun, His path is radiant with loving-kindness. Surely He is present now, for He always comes*

to hearts that need Him. Wiser by far is he, **being** resigned to the divine will, grows by energy of grace to be pleased with his lot in life. We are made perfect through our suffering.

*Suffering, which God accepts, must have His glory at its end. If we do suffer, what is that compared to reigning with Him? When recompense is so eternal, so infinitely more than we had a right to expect, wouldn't you take up His cross and follow Him?*

*I have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. God has promised to save those who trust in Christ. When God looks at me, He sees my union with Christ and that union with our risen Lord is consolation of the highest order. In the weakness of this disease, I have reassurances from God Himself. Though death's arrows may pierce my heart, my consolation and comfort can never die because the living love of God is dwelling in my heart in dying moments.*

*I know many of you are praying for my complete and total healing. Do not hesitate in asking if He is so abundant in giving. There is no treatment and no cure for ALS, so if God does heal me, all the glory will go to Him. He has already healed my heart and my soul, and that is enough for me."*

#### Day 10

Please pray for wisdom for us at the FCAP Office as we are making plans in our publications with the hope and desire of meeting the needs of people in today's airline workplace. We are broadening our horizons by offering more of a variety of electronic publications. Pray they will be utilized for God's glory.

#### Day 11

Debra asks us to pray that she will find new employment within the airline industry. An AirTran flight attendant has remarried and now has five children. Her child from the first marriage is rebelling through these changes. Pray as this woman needs wisdom in knowing how to talk to and pray with her daughter.

#### Day 12

Give thanks for how God continues to use the FCAP group that meets regularly at World Airways. Pray they will be able to continue meeting regularly for fellowship and encouragement in the midst of challenges. A new airport chaplain wants to get more involved with

FCAP at the Atlanta Airport. Pray he would have godly insights as to how God is working there and will be able to join according to God's plans and purposes.

#### Day 13

Pray as new airline friends of FCAP unite with local FCAPers in the New York City area (LaGuardia, JFK, and Newark).

Continue to pray as the Third FCAP Adventure on the Seas (cruise) is scheduled for October 25-30. Pray additional people will be led to participate and even now God will be preparing the hearts of all who will be involved.

New contacts in Nigeria have become acquainted with us through a Delta cargo worker in Atlanta. Pray these new connections will bring others into the awareness of Christians united in fellowship within their workplace.

#### Day 15

Pray for follow up with connections made during our recent Basic Training session, Delta Block Parties, and summer visits with groups in Atlanta. Pray this will lead not only to spiritual renewal and encouragement but also to desire and vision as these people are "divinely placed."

#### Day 16

As a result of changes in our web site and availability of online publications, we have received a number of inquiries and prayer requests. Pray as we respond with the good news of the Gospel, that they will fully realize that abiding in Christ is what makes life worth living.

#### Day 17

FCAPers at several jet bases have requested prayer for outreach to friends and co-workers as they take/make time to talk together. Pray office managers will recognize and acknowledge the importance of this fellowship and these friendships and how it ultimately will help in their daily routine at work.

#### Day 18

Pray for God's hand of blessing, protection and wisdom for John in his new role as chief pilot of a major airline.

A pilot trainee in Asia wrote asking us to pray for a smooth opening of their flying school. It is the first such school in their country. Pray he will be salt and light among those he comes in contact with.

#### Day 19

Give thanks for provision of a new flying job for Mike Patrick. Pray God will open doors for ministry in this new environment just as He did for Mike in his time with ABX Air.

Continue to lift up our Board of Directors as they meet tonight and tomorrow. Pray God's presence will be evident in every deliberation and decision.

#### Day 20

The FCAP Board of Directors will continue meeting through today. Pray the end result of this time will bring great honor to the Lord Jesus and prove effective in accomplishing what God wants to do in the days ahead in the hearts and lives of airline people throughout the world.
